

I recall this time of year, when teachers and staff were preparing to return to school. It was wonderful and exciting for me as an administrator and teacher. It isn't the years that have forced me to give up my keys, and it isn't the outstanding children or their parents. It has always been wonderful when I look back at them. The students and their families have always been fantastic. Now we are working to bring 17 of our grandchildren up through Tintic's educational system. (We have 28 grandchildren in all!) Leigh and I know Tintic School District from the inside out and there isn't a place we would rather have our children receive their education.

Small communities are important, it truly takes a village to raise a child and we are a great village! Years ago, when we could have gone to another school district, I remember how important it was for me to invest in our schools and our community. While things in the world have changed drastically from the simpler times one thing has not changed and that is our love for the children and their parents. We are the short couple yelling at the ball games and wrestling matches. The roar coming from my lungs has been affected by the years, but I still give all I have to support my kids. I consider all the students and their parents as being "my kids." I love them all. I do know they aren't perfect, none of us are, but I know that "God doesn't make any junk."

We love Eureka. We love the children, the youth, the young adults, the parents and the grandparents. I always speak highly and with great respect to others about the people who live in and serve in our community. We also need to thank our local EMTs, the doctors, and nurses at Mountain View and Utah Valley Hospitals for keeping me going. Each day is a blessing and we are so grateful for all the moments that add up to our beautiful life.






