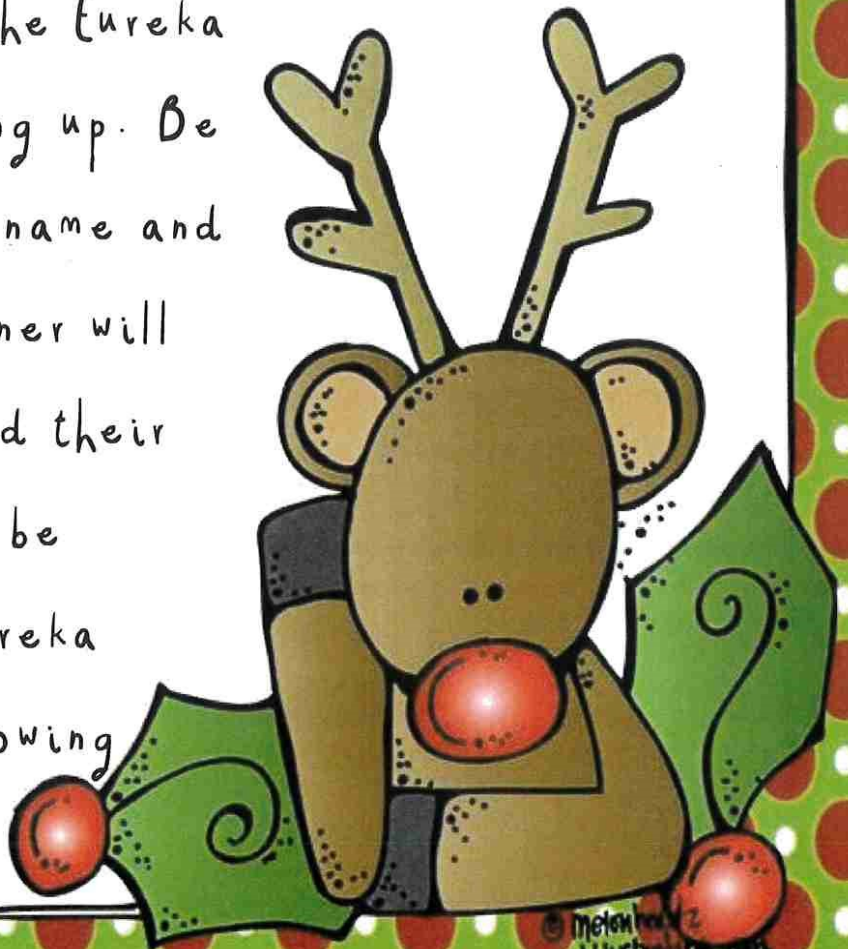

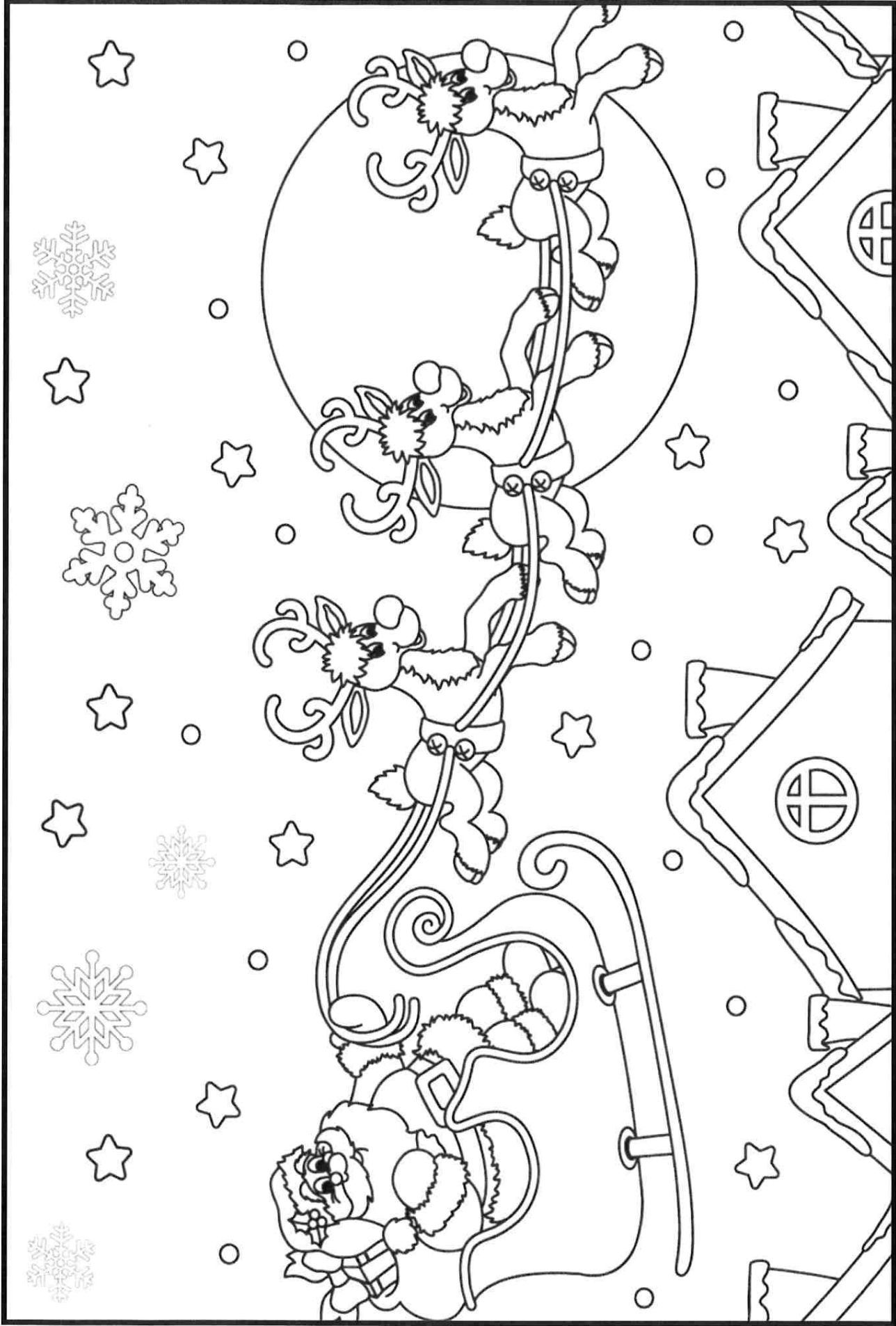

Holiday Travel

With the holiday season officially upon us, traveling is at an all-time high! From students going home to spend time with their families, to families traveling to be together at this happy time of year, navigating the travel world can be crazy. But just because it is crazy, doesn't mean it has to be crazy expensive. Here's some tips to help you keep travel costs down, so you don't have to be a scrooge about visiting grandma for Christmas.

1. Download apps & shop around for prices. It used to be that you spent hours, days, even months, looking for the best deals, and cheapest prices. In today's technology world, there are apps who do that for you! If you are flying, even doing a simple google search of the days you want to travel will come up with multiple options, so you can get the most for your money. If you are driving, my favorite app to use is Gas Buddy. You just type in your current location and it tells you where the cheapest gas is. Use the apps and tools built to help you shop around for the best price.

2. Follow social media accounts who do the work for you! If you don't feel like downloading an app and searching yourself, there are a lot of Instagram and Facebook pages that do the work for you. Some will even send you a weekly email with flight deals so you don't miss out on an opportunity to spend less. Ones that I use are Flights From Home, Cheap Flights, and Thrifty Traveler. These accounts make it a priority to advertise the best deals and how long they'll last making shopping around as easy as logging into your Instagram account and hitting "follow."

3. Bring your own snacks. Airport food is SO expensive. Even a meal at a normally inexpensive place can be more than normal. Packing your own snacks is one way to save money. Did you know TSA guidelines allow you to bring your own food on planes? As long as the food is a solid and not a liquid or gel over 3.4 ounces, you can pack it away! My personal favorite to bring is all the fixings for a sandwich. I use a Tupperware with multiple spaces for food, put my bread in one, and my toppings in another. Then, when I get to my gate before my plane takes off, I make my own sandwich. Easy, inexpensive, and tasty!

4. Bring your own snacks – the car ride version. Do you find yourself stopping at whatever fast food place comes up on the nearest exit and spending some cash on feeding your whole family? Try packing your food instead. One of my favorite ways to save money on a road trip is to pack my meals with me, and instead of stopping at a fast food place, or gas station, I stop at a viewpoint, or picnic area along the route. Not only do you save on food, but you get to make memories of having a picnic at some pretty awesome locations.

5. Take advantage of reward programs. There's a lot of reward programs that can help ease the burden of travel costs. From joining a rental car rewards program, to a hotel loyalty program, you can sometimes get a better deal. It's also easy to use those programs to earn extra points. For example, the Marriott Hotels rewards points system gives you extra for skipping housekeeping on days you are there, or extra points for eating out at local restaurants. Even if you think you don't travel enough to earn points, some rewards systems don't have expiration dates on their points, so eventually you'll earn enough just by traveling home for the holidays!

6. My last tip is to be flexible with your plan. A lot of people are traveling during the holiday season. That means prices that might usually be lower are more expensive. If you are able to be flexible with the dates you leave, for example, leaving on a Tuesday instead of a Monday or a Thursday, instead of a Friday, you might find a better deal, less traffic, and an easier travel time. Traveling during the holidays can be stressful. But, if you spend less, you're more likely to experience less stress and have a better experience! We all want to be with the ones we love during this time, hopefully these tips will help you have a happy holiday traveling experience.

Recipe Corner

Bûche de Noël (Yule Log Cake)

INGREDIENTS:

FOR THE CAKE

Cooking spray
6 large eggs, separated
1/2 c. all-purpose flour
1/4 c. unsweetened cocoa powder

3/4 c. granulated sugar, divided
1/4 tsp. kosher salt
Powdered sugar, for sprinkling

FOR THE FILLING

1 c. heavy cream
1/2 c. powdered sugar

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
Pinch kosher salt

FOR THE FROSTING AND DECORATING

1/2 c. (1 stick) butter, softened
2 c. powdered sugar, plus more for garnish
1/4 c. cocoa powder
1/2 tsp. pure vanilla extract
2 tbsp. heavy cream

Pinch kosher salt
Chocolate curls, for garnish
Cranberries, for garnish
Small rosemary sprigs, for garnish

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350°. Line a jelly roll pan with parchment paper and grease with cooking spray. In a medium bowl mix together flour, cocoa powder, and salt.
2. In a large bowl beat egg yolks until thick. Slowly add 1/2 cup sugar and beat until pale then beat in flour mixture.
3. In another large bowl beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Add remaining 1/4 cup sugar a little at a time and continue to beat until stiff peaks form. Gently fold egg whites into batter in two batches.
4. Pour batter into prepared pan and spread into an even layer. Bake until top springs back when lightly pressed, 12 minutes.
5. Dust a clean kitchen towel with powdered sugar and invert warm cake onto towel. Peel off parchment paper.
6. Starting at the short end, use the towel to tightly roll cake into a log. Let cool completely.
7. Make filling: In a large bowl beat together heavy cream, powdered sugar, pure vanilla extract, and a pinch of salt, until stiff peaks form. Refrigerate until ready to use.
8. When cake is cool, unroll and spread filling evenly over cake. Roll cake back into a log, this time without towel. Place seam side down on a baking sheet and refrigerate until well chilled, 1 hour.
9. Make frosting: In a large bowl beat butter until smooth. Add powdered sugar and cocoa powder and beat until no lumps remain then beat in vanilla, heavy cream, and salt.
10. When ready to serve, trim ends and frost cake with chocolate buttercream. Dust lightly with powdered sugar and top with chocolate curls. Place cranberries and rosemary on log to create mistletoe.

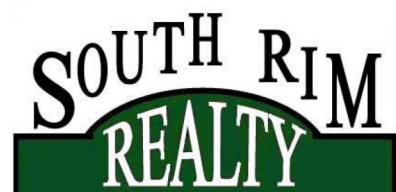

Russell Stephen Maughan

Obituary

Russell Stephen Maughan, age 83, born to Russell Clark Maughan and Mina Roundy in Logan, Utah on April 14, 1936 and passed away November 23, 2019 in Provo, Utah. Stephen (Rusty) grew up mostly in Juab County, where he helped his family dry farm and learned from his father and grandfather how to operate heavy equipment. He participated in high school basketball, baseball and was active in the FFA Program. A few years after graduating from high school he married Golda Joyce Shell. They were later sealed in the Salt Lake LDS Temple on 1966.



Stephen's talent in operating heavy equipment took him to many jobs throughout the state and California. He also worked for Geneva Steel, Utah County, and Orem City. Stephen and Golda raised four children during these years. Stephen enjoyed the outdoors, particularly fishing and hunting, and was a master leather craftsman. It wasn't unusual to find him in the same fishing spot from morning until dark, patiently waiting to catch his limit. A few years after Golda passed away he married June Lee Ladd. He was a resident of Eureka, Utah where he was set apart to help and serve the widows in that community. He then moved to Nephi, where he resided until his health declined.

Stephen was preceded in death by his parents, his wives Golda and June, his youngest son, Verl Dee, granddaughter Lisa Gay Carter. He is survived by his children; Sheldon (Joy), Salem; Brenda (Lee) Leifson, Fayette, Gay Dean (David) Okelberry, Mona. Grandfather of 15 grandchildren and 35 great-grandchildren.

Memorial service will be held at the Anderson Funeral Home, beginning at 11 am, Saturday, November 30, located at 94 W 300 N, Nephi, Utah.

Interment at the Springville Evergreen Cemetery at 2:30.
