Kindergarten Registration 2015-16

Eureka Elementary School Kindergarten Registration will be held on Wednesday, March 18 between the hours of 6:00 - 7:00 p.m. It will take place in the Kindergarten Classroom. In order to attend Kindergarten, your child must be 5 years old by September 1, 2015.

Please bring the following documents with you in order to register your child: Official Birth Certificate (not the hospital copy) Immunization Record Proof of Vision Screening (within 1 year of entering Kindergarten)

Your child must be current on his/her immunizations to attend Kindergarten. The school must have the up-to-date documents on file in order for your child to attend on the first day of school. The immunizations include: 5 DPT, 4 Polio, 3 Hep B, 2 Hep A, 2 MMR, and 1 Varicella (Chicken Pox).


