Fall Safety & Clean-up. Checklist

Please remember that with winter snow here, we have a couple of Ordinances in place for the safety of our citizens:

\* It shall be unlawful for any person who owns or has possession, custody, or control of any motor vehicle to park or knowingly allow to be parked any vehicle on or along U. S. Highway 6, also known as Main Street, within Eureka City limits overnight.

#### (Ordinance No. 2024-01-08-01)

It shall be unlawful to park, leave or abandon a vehicle on any portion of a City Street or right of way of a city street beginning November 1 to March 31. No parking at any time if there is any snow accumulation within the travel lanes regardless of date. Vehicles include but are not limited to automobiles, trucks, trailers, mobile homes, travel trailers, boats, buses, ATV's, snowmobiles, or any device used in the transportation of humans, animals, or freight of any kind.

#### (Ordinance No. 05-14-2023-2)

- \* Also remember to shut-off all outside water and winterize your backflow devices to prevent broken water lines.
- \* Help keep fire hydrants near your homes clear of snow in case of an emergency.
- \* Be a good neighbor and help those in need clear the snow from their walks or driveways.

## Things You Should Know:

- \* Building Permits are required in Eureka for projects such as remodeling/renovating a home, porches, decks, re-roofing, electrical, solar, sheds/structures over 200 sq. ft., new homes, garages, carports, etc.
- \* Business Licenses are required for both In-home and Commercial Businesses. This includes, but is not limited to, the sale of tangible personal property at retail or wholesale, the manufacturing of goods or property and the rendering of personal services for others for a consideration by persons engaged in any profession, trade, craft, business, occupation or other calling, except the rendering of personal services by an employee to his employer under any contract of personal employment.
