Mayor Dever opened the meeting by reading the public hearing notice. Council Member Pugh shared that he had received verbal feedback, emphasizing that the top priorities were addressing dogs running at large and junk cars. Council Member Evans remarked that the ordinance seemed to blend legal jargon with previous conversations involving Shay. Council Member Snell expressed confusion, which was echoed by Recorder Bigler. Council Member Snell speculated that the purpose of rescinding the old ordinance was to incorporate desired elements into the new ordinance.

Mayor Dever identified some key changes:

- 1. Replace "Hearing Officer" with "Mayor."
- 2. Remove section 24-C.

Council Member Snell posed several questions to the Attorney regarding the Administrative Code program. It was noted that the Administrative Code program offered stronger enforcement capabilities compared to the existing nuisance ordinance. A revised version of the program was distributed, followed by a discussion on the revisions and their necessity.
