# EUREKA CITY COUNCIL WORK MEETING NOVEMBER 4, 2019 7:00 P.M.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Castleton open the meeting and led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

a. Suggestion on Roll-off Box for Tires

Charles Davis turned in a proposal for a tire roll-off bin year-round. Council Member Rice was for it. Council Member Carter said he has no objections. He would like Council Member Rice to look into the costs, etc. involved to see if it's feasible, since she is over garbage. Council Member Haynes mentioned he had a concern with people dumping them off outside the fence.

b. Review Town Fee Schedule (Proposed fee schedule attached to last page of meeting notes) Council went over the fee schedule line by line and made changes to the fees based off usage and expense. Recorder Bigler had printed off other Cities fee schedule for the Council to look at. There was a discussion on the rental for the Memorial Building and the Pavilion. On the Memorial Building it was decided to do away with renting by the hour and having a flat fee of \$125 and an additional refundable \$50 cleaning deposit. No longer rent the tables and chairs for off premise use. The Pavilion and propane grill will now have a \$50 refundable cleaning deposit. The Council also discussed fees and perpetual care for the cemetery. Council Member Carter explained to the new members the concerns he has with the water/sewer fees and that includes the maintenance fee. He would like to see a flat service fee.

Doug Meadows was present and asked if he could talk about the tourism initiative he is proposing. The Council agreed to let him continue. He is working on three different tourism projects. One is for more trails for side by sides, mountain biking, and hot springs/mud bath. The Chief is going to donate the land, hot water, and mud and basically have the City operate it. They would also like to deed the property and buildings where the sink hole was to the City and recreate an old Tintic Mining District kind of educational center. The only requirement the Chief has is all the money stays local that would include the people who would be hired to run it. He

said the gentleman from the State who was at the meeting seemed to really like the idea. He is trying to find out if the water is acceptable for humans to use. This would be the water from the Bergin. Council Member Haynes had a question about the buildings. Council Member Carter said we would hire or lease them to a vendor. The City would keep a percentage of profits. Council Member Carter is not against the idea, but he doesn't want the City involved in the day to day operations. Council Member Rice said one of the meetings she attended up at the State was annexation of Chief property. This way any income would come to the City and not to Utah County. Council Member Carter said before he even thinks about or votes on it, he wants to know exactly how much the City will get back from the annexation. He would like it broke down as to how much the City, County, and School would get. This annexation would go clear to Elberta. Council Member Ezell said we would have to fight Utah County for this. Mayor Castleton, Council Member Rice, and Doug Meadows claim that Utah County doesn't want anything to do with this mega site. Doug said when the mine gets started a royalty gets paid and it is going to be a significant amount Council Member Ezell said don't you think Utah County has got that in the back of their minds. Doug doesn't believe they do. Council Member Haynes asked how far are you talking, and Council Member Carter would like to see a map of the area. He said we are not voting on anything until we see a map. Council Member Haynes and Carter want to see facts and numbers. Doug sad he will have their attorney put something together for the Council to see.

- c. Review of Quotes for Services

Not budgeted for this year. We need to look at this again when the new budget comes around. Computech Consulting does offer blocks of hours you can purchase. They would not monitor our computers but would be available when we called them.

d. Review of Joint Cooperative Statement between Eureka City and Dominion Energy The Council looked it over and will vote on it at the Council Meeting on Tuesday. Council Member Carter passed around Overtime Policy/Pay Scale. He would like everyone to take it home read over it. He also brought up a bill we had received from Smith Hartvigsen Attorneys at Law for a phone call to Doug Meadows regarding a proposal to convey water to Eureka City, email correspondence with Matt Jensen regarding water rights, and finally an email correspondence with Mayor Castleton. Mayor Castleton said this has to do with the contract between Chief and Eureka City back when we annexed their property in 2001. It said they could build something like ten homes before they must convey water. He wanted to find out more information from the Attorney. Council Member Carter said we need to ask Attorney Merrill about this contract because it was written in 2002 with Chief Consolidated Mining and they no longer exits. Mayor Castleton said Doug is Chief. Council Member Carter said he may have overstepped his boundaries but when Doug had mentioned to him about conveying water, he told him to keep it. When they build their homes, they need to bring water rights and turn them over to the City. He said all this will need to be discussed with their Attorney and our Attorney. Council Member Carter passed out some more paperwork and asked the Council to look at it. He wants to discuss this in December's closed session. He will need 100% backing from all the Council before we do anything.

#### **Animal Licenses**

As per Eureka City Ordinance No. 980 an Ordinance regulating licensing and control of dogs and other animals within Eureka City Section 13-242 License and Registration Required: It is unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or maintain any dog six or more months old unless such dog has been registered and licensed with Eureka City. Anyone owning, keeping harboring, maintaining three or more dogs over the age of six months shall be considered operating a dog kennel and shall be required to pay an annual kennel license fee of \$25.00 per year upon approval by City Council
